Balkrishna Mabuhang was awarded a PhD degree in Population Studies from the Tribhuvan University. In his doctoral research titled 'Impact of Earthquake-2015 on Vulnerable Populations in Nepal' he explores the impact of the 2015 Nepal earthquake on vulnerable groups or populations from sociodemographic and cultural perspectives. While he finds a clear discrepancy in the impact between socioeconomically, culturally, and demographically dominant populations and vulnerable groups, he also finds that the vulnerable groups- hill Dalit and Janajati got better brought back after five years in recovery than the other groups.
