

Introduction

This body of work is the output from our 4th Non-fiction graphic comics workshop in January of 2024. The stories are based on short anthropological research and visual output on the everyday life of people living, working or passing in the neighbourhood of Patan.

This workshop was a purely hands-on experience and practice based, where both artist and writer collaborated from the get go, practiced various genres and forms of non-fiction comics and at the end screen printed their comic. Promina Shrestha facilitated the workshop through which these comics were produced, with help from Erika Hoffmann-Dilloway, and Julia Christensen

12 participants were from Nepal, and eight of the participants were students from Oberlin College (United States). While the comics focused on the details of everyday life in Patan, the collaborations were international in nature.

This non-fiction graphic anthology is part of the 'BATOGHATO: HIMALAYAN LIVES & LANDSCAPES, AND THE ROADS THAT CHANGE THEM'

The project is a communication initiative focused on a research-based graphic novel that delves into the politics of road construction in rural Nepal. It aims to catalyze discussions on development, democracy, and civil society while introducing graphic storytelling to a wider audience. Through visual narratives, the novel portrays the perspectives of various stakeholders involved in road construction, challenging common narratives about its consequences. The project involves translation, illustration, and collaboration with publishers to ensure accessibility and natural dialogue. Led by Stacy Leigh Pigg and a team of artists and researchers, 'Batoghato' is based on the work of the research group 'Infrastructures of Democracy.'

The project is financially supported by the Open Society Foundations (OSF), Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council (Canada)

Narayan calls Purna through the contact that was mentioned.








Around half a year later, Purna enrolls in a local college.

Two years later, he successfully joins into university for sociology and Nepali journalism.








